OVERVIEW

The NetWorked Community Solutions Grant makes funding in the amount of \$5,000 or \$10,000 available to encourage collaboration among NetWorked participants through cross-sector teambuilding and collective action.

HOW DOES THE RESOURCE WORK?

Grant applications will be accepted from Kansas-based NetWorked project teams that have representation from at least *THREE* different sectors.

Project teams must select:

ONE impact area to focus their project. Eligible impact areas:

and

ONE of the following project types within their chosen impact area:

- Entrepreneurship Support focused on serving entrepreneurs, business owners and/or leaders of social enterprises (not new business starts)
- Health and Health Equity focusing on improving active living, healthy eating, tobacco prevention or reducing disparities in access to care
- Community Development defined as projects that are focused on helping people and/or groups to improve neighborhoods and/or public spaces

- within their chosen impact area:

 Community Input A surveying or
- community conversation project to solicit public input on a matter relevant to the selected impact area

 Community Outreach An event that
- Community Outreach An event that involves gathering the public to discuss and engage in activities that are relevant to the selected impact area
- Community Service A project that engages volunteers and others to benefit an effort, initiative or goal relevant to the selected impact area
- Marketing digital and/or hardcopy campaigns to educate the public on a matter relevant to the selected impact area
